SUMMER FUN AT THE LIBRARY

Ellington will have a Summer Recreation program this July and August! The Library is partnering with the Town of Ellington to produce a combined Reading and Recreation Program for those aged 5 and up. This will be funded in part by the Chautauqua Region Community Foundation with a grant from the Falconer Region Community Fund.

We will have outdoor game days, craft & art sessions, music, a teen writing contest, trivia times and prizes for those completing their reading logs. Special events will include a visit from the Audubon with a program on the Deciduous Eastern Forest and animal habitats. Yoga and Meditation Techniques will be taught by experienced children's Yoga instructor Connie Diablo. Yoga is currently being taught in many schools as teachers have found it to be useful in helping children focus and destress during the school day. Coming for a return visit is Rick Schuller and Jamestown Thunderdrum. Rick will be bringing 30 drums to host a Family Drumming time for all ages in the Town Park. This group came last year and the kids had a lot of fun in this very hands-on participatory program. The art program at St. Bonaventure University will be bringing their Artmobile fully stocked with materials. Their Art Instructors will lead the children in a themed project.

There will be outdoor Game Days on the schedule also. The children will enjoy such games as Human Ring Toss, Pirate Picks, Frisbee Tic Tac Toe and many others.

Our August display case will feature the works of the Summer Recreation Program as the children learn about Huichol Yarn Artists and enjoy creating their own yarn paintings. We'll also have a fun day of creating Rainforest animals with pipe cleaners and natural elements. Silly Rock Monsters will be rounding out the craft times.

For the older children we have the Junior Scratch off tickets they can win every time they check out two Junior books. Award winning author, J. Andersen, will be the judge for our Teen Writing Contest. Those aged 9-14 years old are encouraged to write a short story of fiction between 3 and 10 pages long. They may submit their story anytime from July 9 thru August 15th. Prizes will be awarded on August 30th.

We've worked hard to create a combined program for the kids of Ellington. What do they need to do to participate? They have to register at the library. Even if they only plan on attending one session we still need their names and contact information on file. They are welcome to bring friends as long as we have a parent or guardian who can register them on the day they come. Early registration helps us put a plan in place for materials and snacks for the summer. When you register you'll be given a schedule of events and a reading log. We will award prizes to those children who show they are reading throughout the summer.

We'll open up the registration on Saturday June 15th. That way you can stop at the library while you're driving around checking out the Town wide Garage Sales. The library will be participating in the garage sales by having a book and bake sale on the front lawn. Put Saturday, June 15th on your calendar to enjoy delicious baked goods, buy that used book and get your child registered so they can be involved this summer in the Ellington Library Summer Reading/Summer Recreation Program.

The Books To Get Your Dad If You're Stumped For A Father's Day Gift:

FOR THE DAD WHO THINKS HE KNOWS AMERICAN HISTORY:

Killers of the Flower Moon: The Osage Murders and the Birth of the FBI by David Grann (2017) The members of the Osage Indian nation in Oklahoma were dying. At the start of *Killers of the Flower Moon*, investigative journalist David Grann details how all the members of one Osage family succumbed to mysterious illness and violent attacks. Similar tragedies happened to other families until the tribe was depleted. It just so happened that the Osage tribe's land fell on a highly lucrative plot of oil. For years, they reaped riches from this land — until this slew of (still largely unsolved) murders occurred. In the book, Grann connects these murders back to a shocking conspiracy. Grann told *Rolling Stone*, "This is as close a story to good and evil as I ever came across."

FOR THE DAD WHO LIKES TO LAUGH:

Calypso by David Sedaris (2018)
America's most beloved essayist is back with a collection about aging, vacation homes in South Carolina, and picking up trash on the side of the road in England (his side hustle). In each of his collections, Sedaris lets us into his big, zany family, who might actually have more inside jokes than mine. *Calypso* is perfect for fans of Sedaris and for newcomers alike.

FOR THE DAD CONCERNED WITH COSMIC QUESTIONS:

The Order of Time by Carlo Rovelli (2018)
Has your dad run out of Stephen Hawking books? Fear not. Carlo Rovelli's acclaimed and lofty exploration of time will satisfy similar yearnings. Rovelli approaches time — both what it is and how we experience it — through the lenses of physics, philosophy, science, and literature.

FOR THE DAD WHO SPENDS TIME THINKING ABOUT AMERICA:

Bad Stories by Steve Almond (2018)
In each episode of the *Dear Sugar* advice podcast, which he hosts with Cheryl Strayed, Steve Almond uses his gifts of compassion, observation, and empathy to unravel letter writers' often impossibly hard situations. Almond deploys these skills in his essay collection, *Bad Stories*, only this time, the "letter writer" is America post-November 2016. Almond expertly examines forces at work in the last decade that allowed this historical moment to occur.

FOR THE DAD WHO LOVES PSYCHOLOGICAL THRILLERS

The Good Son by You-Jeong Jeong (2018)
Han Yu-jin wakes up in blood near his mother's body. He can't remember a thing — not how he got there, and not if he did it. Over the next three days, 26-year old Yu-Jin will embark on a terrifying journey through his family and his past to uncover the truth. *The Good Son* is already a hit in South Korea, where it was first published. The buzz has traveled over the Pacific to generate rave reviews in the United States



JULY 25: Cookies, no peanut butter please. 3 dozen needed

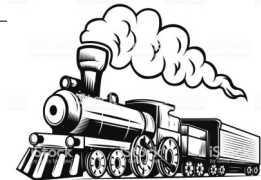
JULY 30: Any kind of popsicles. 3 dozen needed
