

Book Highlights of the Month

ADULT FICTION: WHEN WE WERE YOUNG by Richard Roper

From the author of Something to Live For , a nostalgic, heart-warming story of two long-lost friends who embark on a 184-mile walk of the Thames Path in order to find their way back to the truth, and to their friendship.

Years ago, in their teens, Joel Thompson and Theo Hern promised each other that one day they would walk the entirety of the Thames Path together. Now, about to turn 30, they haven't spoken in years and are in very different places in life. Theo moved back to his parents' house after having a quarter-life crisis, and they've just served him an eviction notice a week before his 30th birthday. Joel, in London, has been doing extremely well—impressive career in television, loving relationship with his high school sweetheart—except for one piece of news he's just received. Wanting to make things right with his old friend, Joel shows up on his doorstep on the morning of Theo's birthday, imploring Theo to finally walk the Thames Path together. Despite his reluctance and the still-fresh pain from their past, Theo meets Joel at the trailhead and the walk begins. Along the way, old wounds will be reopened, but maybe that way they can finally heal. Writing with both great humor and heart, Roper has a light touch that keeps the reader laughing even while he gently pulls on the heartstrings. Theo and Joel have hurt each other in the past, and their history of miscommunication and trauma feels incredibly real, but their longing for reconnection and nostalgia for what they once were also shines through. Even in hard moments, there is an element of farce, especially in scenes when Joel, Theo, and Joel's girlfriend, Amber, play around with who knows what secret. Although the end might not land with everyone, the story of two friends finding each other again will resonate with most.

ADULT NON FICTION: THIS LIFE AND THREE MORE by Kathleen Scott

A collection of poems, essays and musings by Kathleen Scott. Painstakingly written over four decades, "This Life and Three More" is a creative compilation of feelings, observations and perspectives on both the everyday occurrences and the life-altering tragedies that have made up Scott's life thus far. In "He, She, They, We," Scott explores the dynamics of family discord. In "Putting it in Neutral," the author puts into words the internal vacillation between the desire to rest in later years with the impulse to remain in full throttle mode. Told from her uniquely feminine point of view, Scott captures not only what it is to be a woman, but what it means to be daughter, sibling, wife, mother and friend. Every woman will be able to relate to the complex awareness and experiences so truthfully portrayed on these pages. Scott's genuine voice resounds with authenticity, enabling the reader to know that they are not alone in their own experiences and viewpoints. Lightly illustrated, this lyrical book of writings offers solace, insight and simple reading pleasure.






Summer read program kids making yarn wrapped fish and imaginative animals








Great Readers at the Library!

Congratulations to Addison and Aiden for being the top 2 readers in the 2021 Summer Reading Program!




Most of our Summer Read Program kids with about four missing. They all kept track of their reading. Great Job kids!
