PONDERING SNOWFLAKES WAY TOO MUCH

* Snow is formed from water vapors in the cold clouds that have condensed into ice crystals. Ice crystals fasten themselves onto a dust speck. One crystal attaching to another forms a snowflake. Once the snowflake is heavy enough, it falls from the cloud. Usually a snowflake is formed from about 200 of these ice crystals. The size of a snowflake is determined by how many ice crystals join together. There's a famous saying that goes, "no two snowflakes are the same." That theory was debunked in 1988 when Nancy Knight, a scientist at the National Center for Atmosphere Research in Colorado, found two identical snowflakes that came from a storm out of Wisconsin. She found two. Well there is also the saying that "we all have a twin somewhere."

As snowflakes fall to the ground, they will each take their own unique journey, and that journey will determine what they look like. For example, they will look different depending how quickly they fall or whether they get caught in a blustery wind. Even two flakes floating side by side will each be blown through different levels of humidity and vapor to create a shape that is unique so when each one lands it will look different. The human eye is probably not able to see each little difference in the flake thus they all do resemble each other in our eyes.

Let's face it— we're probably all a little like a snowflake. Sometimes the differences in people are easy to see and at other times they can be invisible to the casual observer. We may grow up in the same town, attend the same school and mingle with the same groups and perhaps even participate in the same activities. We perceive people to be "just like us" when this commonness is identified. It would be a mistake to not make the attempt to look deeper at people. Everyone has journeyed through this earth on a different path and been blown by varying degrees of blustery winds. At times we can fall so peaceful and quietly to the ground that it produces a sense of wonderment and awe. Other times we are in a blizzard not of our own making and we resemble lake effect snow that can paralyze a city with its power.

One thing to remember is the snowflake is created by crystals attaching themselves together to form larger flakes. Sounds like no snowflake travels alone through its earthly journey.

I think I've been pondering snowflakes way too much. How about we all just grab ourselves a good book, a hot cup of cocoa, a cozy blanket and enjoy the falling snow with whomever we travel on this life journey. Oh, and a cuddly dog or a purring cat count as travel companions too! If you need a good book to travel with, the library can help with that. Here's hoping that your journey this season resembles a serene snowy day.

ADULT BOOK CLUB MONTHLY SELECTION

The Adult Book Club meets the third Thursday of every month at 11am. In December they will meet on the 15th. They will be discussing the book "A Cold Day in Hell" by Lissa Marie Redmond. New members are always welcome.

BOOK REVIEW: A Cold Day in Hell A detective's complicated past catches up with her when she investigates a murder. Together with her partner, Shane Reese, **Detective Lauren Riley of the Buffalo Police** Department has a great record clearing cold cases. Now a hot one is about to change her life. Frank Violanti, a cocky lawyer who's been her enemy in many a court proceeding, begs her to use her PI license to investigate the murder of Katherine Vine, which took place outside of the Buffalo police jurisdiction. His godson, David Spencer, who admits to having had consensual sex with Katherine in her car, parked near the store where he works, shortly before she was strangled with her own scarf, has been arrested for the murder. Since Lauren's two daughters from her youthful first marriage are both in college, she has some time on her hands. Against her better judgment she takes the case, at least in part because the arresting officer is Joe Wheeler. During the short time she dated him after her first husband bailed, she realized that Wheeler was a bad cop who was physically abusive to her. Unchanged by time, he expresses his rage over her interference after the first court hearing by punching her in the face. Although Lauren divorced her second husband, Mark Hathaway, for cheating, their sexual chemistry flares up when they meet again despite Lauren's reservations. After Mark, who runs with the same crowd, tells Lauren that Katherine's wealthy, well-connected husband has been having an affair, she comes up with plenty of information casting doubt on the case against David but also learns a few unsettling facts about his past. Stalked by a furious Wheeler and harassed by the unhappy district attorney, Lauren has all she can do to keep her life together.

The first in a planned series by Redmond, a retired police detective, is an excellent police procedural combined with a psychological thriller.

Book Highlights of the Month

ADULT FICTION: WE ARE THE LIGHT BY MATTHEW QUICK

When it comes to facing tragedy and trauma, Quick's novel shows us that it definitely takes a village to heal and move on.

The author of The Silver Linings Playbook (2008) tells a story of unexpected twists and turns on the road to recovery after a shattering tragedy.

Lucas Goodgame is dealing with a lot. He's a high school counselor in Majestic, Pennsylvania, who survived a mass shooting in the town's historic theater. His wife, Darcy, was killed and has been transformed into an angel; his analyst, whose own wife was killed in the shooting, won't answer his desperate letters; and there's a kid camped in his yard who might hold the key to helping the town heal. Quick became a household name thanks to his debut novel and the 2012 Oscar-winning movie adaptation, and he's conjured a similar feeling of community and tender family affection here, with plenty of people helping Lucas cope with the unimaginable. That includes Jill, owner of the local coffee shop and his late wife's best friend. Jill feeds and cares for Lucas, and it's clear she wants more from him, but he's not ready—not when the angelic Darcy is visiting him at night, wrapping her wings around him and leaving feathers on his bed in the morning. But it's Eli, the shooter's younger brother, who has the greatest impact on Lucas' recovery. Eli is struggling with guilt—he saw his brother's behavior take a sinister turn and didn't warn anyone—and he pitches a tent behind his former counselor's house. Soon, inspired by Darcy's enigmatic words—"the boy is the way forward"—Lucas realizes that helping Eli make a monster movie for his senior class project just might help the teen, the traumatized survivors, and the town find meaning in the senseless deaths of 17 of its citizens. The novel is timely in light of what's taking place in the U.S. now, and some characters turn their grief into political activism, but that's not Quick's focus. He doesn't delve into issues like gun control or the shooter's motivations, which makes the story feel superficial at times. Instead, his focus is on Lucas' healing journey, the people who love him (we should all be so lucky), and how the mind makes "valiant attempts to protect us" until we're ready to deal with our losses.

If you're unsure what book to get the young reader in your life, ask them questions about what movies they like, YouTube channels they follow, things they do in their free time, or the last book they enjoyed. Here are some 'kid-approved' picks for tween readers.

THE AREA 51 FILES BY JULIE BUXBAUM

When Sky goes to live with her mysterious uncle, she doesn't know she will meet two new best friends — an alien and a hedgehog. Hilarious antics, lovable characters, and engaging artwork make this highly illustrated novel an excellent choice for kids who love series like The Last Kids on Earth.

TUMBLE BY CELIA C. PÉREZ

An emotion-filled coming-of-age story about the power of family told from 12-year-old Addie Ramírez's perspective. When her stepfather offers to adopt her, she goes on a mission to uncover more about her biological family that leads to a journey of self-reflection and acceptance.

JENNIFER CHAN IS NOT ALONE BY TAE KELLER

When middle schooler Jennifer Chan goes missing, her classmate Mallory becomes obsessed with finding her. The mystery of why Mallory cares so deeply slowly unfolds in this gripping story about friendship, bullying, being yourself, and... aliens. Sad yet hopeful, this beautifully written story tackles 'real kid issues' like belonging and identity in a kid-appropriate way.

FUTURELAND: BATTLE FOR THE PARK BY H.D. HUNTER,

Imagine a theme park that lets you experience your wildest dreams — that's Futureland. When a few kids go missing from the park, the founders' son, Cam, embarks on a mission to find the kids and the truth. This book will keep kids of all ages laughing and problem-solving for hours. It offers a mix of "quick hitter" short riddles, math logic problems, and longer stories filled with more complex situations to solve. It is a fantastic gift to get the whole family's creative juices flowing.

WHEN YOU REACH ME BY REBECCA STEAD

This perennial favorite for older tweens blends elements of science fiction and friendship drama with the twists and turns of a page-turning mystery. Miranda and Sal have been NYC neighbors and best friends forever. Suddenly, Sal starts doing out-of-character things (like punching another kid), and Miranda finds odd notes with mysterious messages about saving a life. The friends must work together to solve a puzzle and prevent a tragedy.

• THE CITY OF EMBER BY JEANNE DUPRAU

Ember is a city created by the Builders to harbor and protect the human race. But their utopia starts to crumble as food becomes scarce and energy less stable. will be here until 11am for your




