We continued to provide to the community, programs such as Concerts, the annual Easter Egg Hunt, Santa Pancake Breakfast and our Potluck Breakfast was back for a few months of the year. Our Community Room was used 37 times by groups such as the Cub Scouts, Bible Study, school tutoring, Town Picnic meetings and more.

It was a pleasure to welcome 9 new artists to our monthly display case and 3 groups who shared their interesting collections.

The summer brought not only our Summer Reading participants but another 101 people who came to visit our library as they were participating in the CCLS Library Road Trip. We had a great time showing off our little library to all who visited.

New technology available: We received the Telehealth Bundle, which includes a finger pulse oximeter, Infrared Forehead Thermometer and Blood Pressure monitor all to be used with a new laptop that is to be kept exclusively for telehealth visits only. We also have adaptive devices on one computer to assist with vision or range of hand mobility issues. These adaptive devices were made available to us from the Chautauqua Cattaraugus Library System through a grant from the American Rescue Protection Act (ARPA) through New York State.
